NPP Mission:

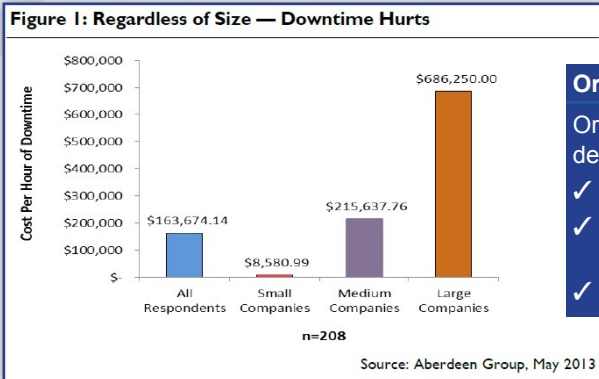
Building the readiness of private stakeholders in Nebraska to prepare, mitigate, respond to and recover from disasters through advocacy, training and public partnerships.

Organization Size Criteria

Organization size for the purposes of this report was determined by the following criteria:

- ✓ Small, under \$50 million in annual revenue
- ✓ Mid-sized, between \$50 million and \$1 billion in annual revenue
- ✓ Large, over \$1 billion in annual revenue



85% of critical infrastructure is owned by the private sector.

40% of small businesses that close due to disaster never reopen.

Nebraska is 1 of 8 states that does not have a system in place to incorporate local business into emergency preparedness and response. NPP wants to fill that gap and help companies reduce down time and prevent closure.
